It is illegal to hold a mobile device when driving but did you know this also applies to smart watches? The law still applies if you are stopped at traffic lights or even if you are supervising a learner driver and not behind the wheel yourself.

You must stay in full control of your vehicle at all times. The police can stop you if they think you're not in control because you're distracted.

Evidence has shown a huge rise in mobile use behind the wheel, with the figure increasing massively in recently years.

If your mobile device is not correctly mounted in your vehicle you can also be penalised and get 3 penalty points if it's deemed it interferes with your full view of the road or if it means you don't have proper control of the vehicle.

By using a mobile device behind the wheel you can get 6 penalty points and a £200 fine! You will also lose your licence if you passed your test in the last 2 years. If the matter is taken to court, you can get a maximum fine of £1,000 or up to £2,500 if you're driving a lorry or bus. You can also receive a driving ban!
